

TAARC/ARES Net Preamble

[Note: Blue text enclosed in [Brackets] is **Instructional** and is not intended to be read 'over the air'.]

CQ, CQ, CQ. Calling ALL Amateur Radio operators - This is _____ with the Tarleton Area Amateur Radio Club Net. My name is _____ and I will be your Net Control Station this evening.

This is a Training Net for passing information concerning Emergency Preparedness, SKYWARN, and Amateur Radio in general, as well as other information of interest to the Tarleton Area Amateur Radio Club and the local amateur radio community.

This net is affiliated with the Amateur Radio Emergency Service and is presented by the Tarleton Area ARC. This net meets on Tuesday evenings at 2200 local time, except for the first Tuesday of each month. Nets are held on the K5IYY repeater in Stephenville, Texas operating at 147-dot-360 MHz. This repeater has a positive offset and uses a 110-dot-9 tone. Operators of other repeaters who wish to link with the K5IYY repeater for this net are welcome to do so.

All properly licensed amateur radio operators are welcome to join this session of the Tarleton Area Amateur Radio Club Net. This is an open net serving all Amateur Radio Operators -- and we also welcome all those who are listening this evening on scanners.

This is a Directed Net. Please follow the instructions of the Net Control Station. When joining this net, please let the Net Control Station know if you are short of time or if you must leave the net early. Also, please advise Net Control if you have items for the Swap Net that will be held after this ARES Net.

When you check in, please give your call phonetically using ITU Standard Phonetics and give your name and location. Remember to pause for a couple seconds after keying your mic to give all linked repeaters a chance to key up. This is _____, Net Control, with the TAARC Net.

[Remember to ID your station and the Net at regular intervals.]

Are there any stations at this time with **Emergency** or **Priority** traffic? Please check in now.

[Handle IMMEDIATELY!] [Recognize any identifying stations and handle requests.]

[When acknowledging stations, ALWAYS repeat their call sign phonetically, using ITU Standard Phonetics.]

Are there any stations on backup or emergency power or any mobiles that may be leaving the coverage area of the repeater soon? Please come now.

[Record their call and handle their traffic IMMEDIATELY]

This is _____, Net Control, with the TAARC Net. I'll open the Net now for general check-ins. Stations with Emergency or Priority traffic at any time during this net may break in by saying, "Break, Break." Please use ITU Standard Phonetics when identifying your station and give your name and location. Will the first four stations please check in now.

[Record and acknowledge all stations that check-in.] [Repeat as required]

[Acknowledge additional stations with traffic now. Then recall stations that listed traffic during check-ins. Handle traffic in this order - 1. NTS, 2. Bulletin, 3. Announcements, 4. Swap Net.]

The Tarleton Area Amateur Radio Club holds meetings on the first Tuesday of each month at 1900 local time. Meetings are held in Room 103 of the Science Building on campus at Tarleton State University in Stephenville. The Science Building is on the North-West corner of Lillian and Vanderbilt and parking is in the lot on the north side of the building. Talk-in is on the 147-dot-360 MHz repeater. Meetings are open to anyone interested and VE testing is offered after each meeting. Walk-ins are always welcome.
